# KIOWA TRIBE RESOLUTION NO. KL-CY-2017-032

## SELF-DETERMINATION 638-CONTRACTS AUTHORIZATION ACT OF 2017

At a duly called Session of the Legislature of the Kiowa Tribe held this 9th day of December, 2017, the following Resolution and Law were adopted.

WHEREAS; the Legislature is vested with the authority to pass laws and resolutions pursuant to Article VI, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the Kiowa Tribe ("Constitution"); and,

WHEARAS; the Kiowa Tribe ("Tribe") has entered into Self-Determination "638" contracts ("638-Contracts) with the Bureau of Indian Affairs ("BIA") that has provided critical funding to operation important programs that deliver valuable services to the members of the Tribe; and,

WHEREAS; the Tribe recently experienced several years of internal governmental strife resulting in the disruption of the Self-Determination 638-Contracts with the federal government and a disruption of available federal funding for the Tribe's programs; and,

WHEREAS; in late October 2017, the BIA notified the Legislature of the need for an updated authorization for the Chairman of the Tribe to enter into 638-Contracts with BIA on behalf of the Tribe;

WHEREAS; the Legislature supports and encourages the Chairman and Executive Branch Departments to apply for and obtain all available 638-Contracts and funds for the benefit of the Tribe; and,

WHEREAS; the Legislature finds it in the best interests of the Tribe to provide the Chairman and Executive Branch with an efficient and streamlined process to authorize the Tribe to apply for and receive grant funds;

NOW THEREFORE IT BE IT RESOLVED; that the Legislature hereby enacts the attached law entitled, "SELF-DETERMINATION 638-CONTRACTS AUTHORIZATION ACT OF 2017", authorizing the Chairman to negotiate and execute 638-Contracts with the federal government and the BIA on behalf of the Tribe.

#### Section 1.1 Short Title

This enactment shall be known as, the "SELF-DETERMINATION 638-CONTRACTS AUTHORIZATION ACT OF 2017" ("Act").

#### Section 1.2 Findings.

- (c) The Tribe recently experienced several years of internal governmental strife resulting in the disruption of the Self-Determination 638-Contracts with the federal government and a disruption of available federal funding for the Tribe's programs; and,
- (d) In late October 2017, the BIA notified the Legislature of the need for an updated authorization for the Chairman of the Tribe to enter into 638-Contracts with BIA on behalf of the Tribe;

#### Section 1.3 Purpose.

The purpose of this Act is to authorize the Chairman of the Tribe to negotiate and execute Self-Determination 638-Contracts with the federal government and BIA to receive federal funds to operate critical programs for the delivery of services to members of the Tribe;

## Section 1.4 Authorization to Enter Into 638-Contracts.

The Legislature hereby authorizes and directs the Chairman to negotiate and execute 638-Contracts with the federal government and the BIA on behalf of the Tribe. The Chairman shall be authorized to execute all necessary documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Act.

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
