# KIOWA TRIBE RESOLUTION NO. KL-CY-2018-018

## PRISONER RE-ENTRY PROGRAM ESTABLISHMENT ACT OF 2018

At a duly called Session of the Legislature of the Kiowa Tribe held this 8<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2018, the following Resolution and Law were adopted.

WHEREAS; The Legislature is vested with the authority to pass laws and resolutions pursuant to Article VI, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the Klowa Tribe; and,

WHEREAS; Nearly every person who is incarcerated in a State or Federal prison will eventually be released and, in many cases, will return to their families and communities; and,

WHEREAS; The Prisoner Re-Entry Program is being structured by this resolution, funding will be identified & included in the Kiowa Tribal Budged for the next fiscal Year 2019; and,

WHEREAS; Many Members of the Tribe who have been incarcerated have returned to their families and the Tribe's communities to become productive members of society; and,

WHEREAS; The Legislature has identified the need to provide temporary support services to recently released prisoners to facilitate their reintegration into society and to reduce recidivism.

NOW THEREFORE IT BE IT RESOLVED; that the Legislature hereby enacts the attached law entitled, "Prisoner Re-Entry Program Establishment Act of 2018".

## Section 1.1 Short Title

This enactment shall be known as, the "Prisoner Re-Entry Program Establishment Act of 2018" ("Act").

#### Section 1.2 Purpose.

The purpose of the Act is to establish a Prisoner Re-Entry Program to assist Members of the Tribe who have served time in prison with support services to re-enter society including assistance with housing, education, employment, counseling, and other related services.

#### Section 1.3 Findings.

- (a) Nearly every person who is incarcerated in a State or Federal prison will eventually be released and, in many cases, will return to their families and communities; and,
- (b) Many Members of the Tribe who have been incarcerated have returned to their families and the Tribe's communities to become productive members of society; and,
- (c) The Legislature has identified the need to provide temporary support services to recently released prisoners to facilitate their reintegration into society and to reduce recidivism.

### Section 1.4 Establishment of the Prisoner Re-Entry Program.

- (a) The Legislature hereby establishes the Prisoner Re-Entry Program within the Executive branch of government.
- (b) The Prisoner Re-Entry Program shall assist Members of the Tribe who have served time in prison with support services to re-enter society including but not limited to assistance with housing, education, employment, counseling, and other related services.
- (c) The Legislature hereby authorizes up to \$150,000 for the Prisoner Re-Entry Program, subject to final appropriation of funds in an Annual Budget or Budget Modification.
